## 'Siberian' Chiffchaff (Phylloscopus collybita tristis)

A rare visitor from Siberia, from Urals eastwards, with 100-145 per year in the UK (Hume *et al.* 2016). Treated as a subspecies of Chiffchaff (*Phylloscopus collybita* collybita) by BOURC, though is treated as a full monotypic species by Dutch CDNA.

Date: 30/11 – 9/12/19
Location: Auchenharvie Pond area, Stevenston,

North Ayrshire

Found by Jason McManus, initially identified by the higher pitched call than *collybita*. Song is very different from *collybita* though was not heard during its time at Auchenharvie.



There are morphological similarities with subspecies *abietinus* (clearly differentiated by call and song) and these two subspecies do overlap in range, so hybrids could not be ruled out (Shirihai & Svensson 2018). Ageing without seeing the bird in the hand is unreliable.

## Summary

Whilst there are obvious morphological differences which clearly indicate this subspecies, there are some who may also require a recording of its call and song or DNA for safe identification. This subspecies is currently not reviewed by BBRC, SBRC or ABRC.
